LGBTIQA+ Youth Inclusiveness Resources For Schools and Services

According to <u>LGBTIQ+ Health Australia</u>, during childhood and adolescence is when LGBTIQA+ people are most likely to realise and explore their identities and experiences, and LGBTIQA+ young people are choosing to be visible at a younger age than ever before.

Despite this, and a greater community awareness, LGBTIQA+ young people are still exposed to stigma, discrimination, harassment & safety concerns, which significantly impacts their health and wellbeing. Australian research shows 40.8% of young people reporting verbal harassment based on their sexuality or gender identity, & 60.2% of LGBTIQA+ young people feeling unsafe & uncomfortable at high school (Writing Themselves In 4 Report, Feb. 2021). Also, 63% of LGBTIQA+ young people reported a diagnosed mental health condition, compared to 26% of young people in a general youth population (LGBTIQ+ Health Australia, Snapshot Report 2021)

LGBTIQA+ young people are looking for support and acceptance within their local communities

To help young people improve their safety and acceptance within their schools and communities, we have put together this document full of resources to assist with LGBTIQA+ youth inclusiveness.
